


DFPS Disproportionality & Disparity Analysis 2024

Travis County Moves the Needle

According the 2024 DFPS Disproportionality and Disparities Analysis, "Travis County showed the largest disparities of the seven largest counties, with African American children 4.8 times more likely to be reported, 5.6 times more likely to be investigated, and 6.1 times more likely to be removed than White children; however, Travis County also showed the largest decrease in disparity for African American children removed, from 10.1 in FY 2023 to 6.1 in FY 2024."

The report lists over key take aways:

- Across Texas, racial/ethnic disparities followed similar trends between FY2023 and FY2024.
- Statewide, compared to White children, African American children are:
- o 1.9 times more likely to be reported,
- o 2.2 times more likely to be investigated,
- ∘ 2.1 times more likely to be removed.
- Statewide, Hispanic children had similar outcomes compared to White children.




 Latine/Hispanic children in Travis County experienced disparities from 2.1 to 2.6 times more likely at each decision point

The decrease in the removal disparity in Travis County "may be largely attributed to the intentional focus in Travis County of multi-system community partnerships, including judicial, educational and child welfare partners, which impact child welfare outcomes."


KIDS COUNT POLICY REPORT
